Historic Summit Inn

Jefferson Hills. PA 15025-3652

The Summit Inn is one of the last remaining grand porch hotels in America. The history of The Summit Inn really begins in 1806 when Albert Gallatin, the Secretary of the Treasury under President Thomas Jefferson, suggested a National Road "to connect the East with the West." Albert Gallatin lived only twenty miles from the present day Summit Inn.

The Summit Hotel was first opened to the public in 1907. Due to its excellent facilities, it's location on Chestnut Ridge, and the beautiful views, the resort was an immediate success. The original hotel register, proudly displayed in the lobby, dates back to 1917 when Henry Ford, Harvey Firestone, and Thomas Edison brought the American Science Wizards here to test their inventions up and down the mountain.

In 1924 the worlds first all steel Olympic outdoor pool was added. In 1930 a colorful German named Leo Heyn purchased the complex and helped the Inn gain national recognition. The German influence of Leo Heyn can still be seen in our Baron Munchausen Room, a hoffbrau style pub.



Weeknight rates at this venue normally range from \$174 to \$314 per night. We have secured a block of rooms at a very special conference rate of \$159 per night. However, in order to receive this reduced conference rate, your room must be booked by August 12th. Rooms booked after this date will be booked at market rate.

THINGS TO DO NEARBY

Laurel Caverns (9 minute drive)

Laurel Caverns is a large natural calcareous sandstone cave located 50 miles south of Pittsburgh. Most of the passage ceilings in its four mile labyrinth are between ten and twenty feet high (many as high as 50 feet) with an average width of over twelve feet. This makes it the largest cave in Pennsylvania. If classified as a sandstone cave, it is the largest sandstone cave in the world. The cave itself is situated beneath a 435 acre privately owned geological preserve. Because this property is at the top of Chestnut Ridge, all of the water that enters the cave is pristine.

The battle at Fort Necessity in the summer of 1754 was the opening action of the French and Indian War. This war was a clash of British, French and American Indian cultures. It ended with the removal of French power from North America. The stage was set for the American Revolution. The Interpretive and Education Center is open every day from 9-5.

Kentuck Knob represents a refinement of the many principles of organic architecture Frank Lloyd Wright explored throughout his long career. Both dramatic and serene, the house, situated just below the crest of the hill, appears almost part of the mountain itself and stands 2,050 feet above sea level. Designed on a hexagonal module, Kentuck Knob is a 2200 sq. ft., one-level Usonian home.

Ohiopyle State Park (18 minute drive)

An absolutely beautiful state park situated on 20,500 acres of land. The focal point of the park is the more than 14 miles (23 km) of the Youghiogheny River Gorge that passes through the park. The river provides some of the best whitewater boating in the Eastern United States. Ohiopyle State Park is a popular destination for rafting, kayaking, and canoeing, but it also has over 100 miles of trails that are open to hiking, horseback riding, cross-country skiing, mountain bikes and snowmobiles. The trails pass by several of the park's waterfalls (pictured right) and ascend the mountains to scenic overlooks.



Morning Seminars (8:30 am - 12:00 pm)

2021 IBC Types of Construction and Application (3.0 hours)

Together with occupancy classification, one of the most critical steps in analyzing a building for code compliance is classifying it for type of construction purposes. This seminar will address the two distinct aspects regarding the use of construction type in the IBC:

- 1) Determination of the appropriate types of construction for a building based on the building's occupancy, height and area, and
- 2) Identification of the construction and fire-resistance-rated features associated with the 12 individual construction types established in the IBC.

In addition, the permissible use of combustible materials in Type I and II noncombustible buildings will be addressed.

2019 NFPA 13D Fire Sprinkler Design, Plan Review & Inspection (3.0 hours)

This course reviews and analyzes selected requirements for residential design, plan review, and inspection of automatic fire sprinkler systems. The course will provide participants with a thorough understanding of key areas of the 2019 edition of NFPA 13D and related International Residential & Samp; Building Code (IRC & Samp; IBC) sections.

2021 International Property Maintenance Code (IPMC) (3.0 hours)

This session reviews the changes and updates to the 2021 IPMC. The session will also discuss common violations and application of this code for the Property Maintenance Inspector. Please make your session selections on Page 4.

Wednesday, September 10th Cont...

Afternoon Seminars (1:30 pm - 5:00 pm)

IBC Occupancy Classification (3.0 hours)

The initial determination for buildings regulated under the IBC is the classification of uses by occupancy. This seminar will focus on the importance of proper occupancy classification as each of the 26 classifications set forth in IBC. Chapter 3 will be reviewed as to the anticipated hazards involved. In addition, the concept and application of the incidental use provisions will be discussed.

2021 IBC Fire Resistant Rated Construction (3.0 hours)

This course focuses on elements of buildings that are required to be fire resistance rated due to provisions of the 2021 International Building Code (IBC). The course will provide participants with a thorough understanding of key areas regarding occupancies and construction types, with topics including fire resistance rated construction, shaft enclosures, fire doors, fire windows, penetrations and joints, fire blocking and draft stopping.

Afternoon Seminars (1:30 pm - 3:30 pm)

Wood Frame Residential Detailing (2.0 hours)

This session provides Code Officials, Designers, Architects, Builders, and Engineers with the practical assessment of wood framing construction practices and detailing.

Pennsylvania Personal Care/Assisted Living Residence Regulations (2.0 Hours)

This session will discuss Personal Care/Assisted Living Residence regulations as they pertain to Pennsylvanian Uniform Construction Codes. This presentation is presented by the Pennsylvania Department of Human Services.

Afternoon Seminars (4:00 pm - 5:00 pm)

How to Read Truss and Placement Diagram Documentation (1.0 hour)

Learn the basic information included on wood truss designs and the truss placement diagram and how they work together.

Code Enforcement Forum—Current Issues & Trends (1.0 hour)

A round table discussion with seasoned Code Professionals discussing current issues and trends that affect our vocation.

2021 IBC Significant Nonstructural Changes (6.0 hours-Continues in Afternoon.)

This session overviews the changes from the 2018 to the 2021 IBC®, identifies changes in organization and code requirements and the applicability of these requirements to design, plan review and inspection. This class uses the Significant Changes to the International Building Code, 2021 Edition. The goal of 2021 IBC Significant Nonstructural Changes is to familiarize building officials, fire officials, plans examiners, inspectors, design professionals, contractors, and others in the construction industry with many of the important changes in the 2021 International Building Code® (IBC®).

National Electric Code (NEC) Residential (3.0 hours)

This session reviews and analyzes selected areas for residential electrical design, inspection, and construction. The course will provide participants with a thorough understanding of key areas regarding wiring methods, electrical equipment for general use, branch circuits, grounding, and bonding requirements of the NEC related to residential installations.

The Basics of Commercial Hood Systems (1.5 hours)

This session will cover each chapter from NFPA 96, the Standard for Ventilation Control and Fire Protection Commercial Cooking Operations. A review of codes pertinent to ensure every exhaust system performs the functions above in promoting life safety and standards of IKECA, International Kitchen Exhaust Cleaning Association.

Code Enforcement Hot Topics (1.5 hours)

This session will discuss basic code enforcement aspects including case preparation, preparing complaints, courtroom conduct and administrative search warrants.

Morning Seminars (10:30 am - 12:00 pm)

Zoning Hot Topics (1.5 hours)

This course will review the latest hot topics and land uses in zoning.

Bi Directional Amplifiers (BDA's) (1.5 hours)

This session will provide an overview of what they are, why they are required and the current code requirements for their use and installation.

NFPA 72- National Fire Alarm Code (3.0 hours)

This session will provide an overview of the National Fire Alarm Code.

2021 IBC & Federal Accessibility Requirements (3.0 hours)

This course will provide participants with effective training to clearly understand minimum

requirements regarding new and existing construction of accessible commercial facilities for compliance with the 2021 International Building Code (IBC), federal standards, and ICC A117.1-2017 Accessible and Usable Buildings and Facilities. The course addresses concepts in design, plan review and inspection of commercial buildings to ensure that people with physical impairments, visual impairments and hearing impairments can use the facilities.

Hydronic Heating Systems (3.0 hours)

This session will review the Basics of Hydronic Heating Systems and their components. How to identify and select the correct boiler for the specific application. Circulator Pumps — Their function and how to properly size them. Discuss Expansion Tanks and why they are needed, Air elimination in Hydronic Systems and Heat emitters.

PA UCC Residential Code Update (3.0 hours)

Part 1 (1 hr.) This session will review implications of transitioning to the 2021 ICC base codes, discuss PA legislative and RAC amendments, and dive into some highlights of the new code provisions for residential construction.

Part 2 (1 hr.) This session will build on Part 1 by providing an overview of the most substantial changes between the 2018 and 2021 ICC base codes for residential construction.

Decked Out: A Dive into the Updated 2021 IRC Deck Code Provisions (1 hr.) This session will address the current and updated provisions in Chapter 5 of the 2021 IRC for decks.
