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Understanding Legal Postings Under PA UCC Section 403

In the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, the Uniform Construction Code (PA UCC) governs how building departments handle safety, construction, and enforcement. If your property has been posted or cited under any of the following sections, here's what you need to know:

★ Types of Legal Postings

- Order to Show Cause / Order to Vacate Section 403.83
- Unsafe Structure Postings Section 403.84
- Stop Work Order Section 403.81
- Fire Damage or Violation Postings Local enforcement protocols may apply
- Property Maintenance IPMC Postings & Enforcement Local enforcement protocols may apply

What Happens When a Structure Is Posted?

A Building Code Official (BCO) or their designee (e.g., Building or Fire Inspector) will:

- Send you a written notice via certified or regular mail.
- Physically post the structure or equipment with the legal order.
- Include **specific instructions** to resolve the issue.
- Provide appeal process to posted legal notifications.

⚠ Important: Once posted, the order is legally binding and cannot be lifted without proper documentation and approval.



You should immediately consult a Pennsylvania Design Professional such as a:

- Licensed Pennsylvania Architect
- Licensed Pennsylvania Engineer

These professionals are qualified to:

- Interpret design issues
- Meet with you and represent your civil interest
- Create sealed design plans for required minimum code compliance
- Assist with building layouts and code compliance





What Documentation Is Required?

Your submission must include:

- 1. A list of affected areas as described in the legal notice.
- 2. A sealed design that meets minimum code requirements for all affected sections.
- 3. Details of any ongoing construction to date not yet reviewed by inspectors.

- All communication must be in writing (legible).
- Submit all documents to the Building Code Official for review and approvals.
- Verbal discussions, phone calls, or onsite chats are not legally valid for permissions or approvals.

Timeliness & Responsibility

The Building Department will work diligently to resolve your case. However:

- You (or your agent) are solely responsible for submitting:
 - o Required documents- in writing and legible
 - o Sealed designs-PA Design Professional
 - o Legal applications- PA UCC Applications at local Building Department
